

Oak Class

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the start of what I'm sure will be a very productive Spring Term. We have our new theme of Planet Earth and we are looking forward to Oak Class not only enjoying their learning, but making positive steps forward in the own journeys.

During Maths this term we will be building on addition and subtraction within 100, looking at multiplication and division, as well as continuing our knowledge of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Length and Height will also be covered, as will looking at statistics; namely tally charts and pictograms. In English we will be using the story Leaf by Sandra Diekmann, looking at how to write to entertain by using drawings, writing, sequencing, focusing on favourite parts, innovating the story and editing their writing. In Science, Oak class will be learning about animals and their habitats, understanding when something is living, or dead, or has never been alive. We will be researching animals; their food chains, whether they are prey or predators and if they are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores, looking at classifications, domestic and wild animals, and the body parts of animals.

In Geography we will be looking at the different continents, habitats and cold areas versus hot. During PE, Oak class will be using dance to explore shapes to music, followed by gymnastics, making shapes whilst being an explorer. In RSHE we will be looking at identifying safe adults in our community, how to be safe online, how to respond to strangers and what physical boundaries are and what is private. In Art we will be looking at Franz Marc and Henri Rousseau to inspire our paintings. In DT our focus will be looking at and making a healthy meal. During music, Oak will be sequencing musical notes and creating patterns, to be able to share a group performance. In phonics we will continue in our groups to target specific areas. To assist your child with their reading, please remember to complete Boom Reader or write in their reading journal to say you have heard them read.
